1. Tick the attitude that you think being correct.

- A. I know the way to go to school by heart: I can chat with my friends and be less careful on the road.
- B. I'm late but I take my time on the road and I wait for the pedestrian's green light before crossing the street.
- C. When pedestrian's light is green, I don't have to look to the right and to the left: I can cross safely.

ANSWERS

- 1. Réponse B.** Even if you know the way very well, even if you are late and even if you have the right to cross (pedestrian light green), you always must be careful, take the time to look to the right and to the left before crossing, and make yourself sure that road is free before starting to cross.
- 2. Answer B.** Effectively, I look to the right then to the left. If road is free, I cross quietly, keeping on being careful. I must never bolt or play on the road.
- 3. Answer C.** Road signs are placed at the edge of the roads to give information to the drivers about the road (danger, indication, obligation). They are classified by “family”: a shape and colour match with a signification. For example, a red background means an interdiction. It’s compulsory to respect them, they are part of the Highway Code.
- 4. Answer C.** Road signs are for all the vehicles (cars, motorbikes, bikes, etc) and pedestrians.
- 5. Answer B.** At night, it’s darker and pedestrians are less visible. Therefore you have to respect the rules to cross the street, be careful and the most visible possible. You must wear some clear clothing, reflecting accessories and, if possible, you must cross on enlightened crosswalks.
- 6. Answer A.** At night, we can see less good and less far... Jules must be very careful on his way back from school and wear the right equipment (reflecting accessories and clear clothing).
- 7. Answer B.** Road is not a playground. Therefore there’s a code to respect to not be in danger. Before starting to ride, you must check your bike. When they are some, it’s better to ride on bicycle paths, especially adapted to bikes
- 8. Answers A, C and D.** It’s an obligation to wear a helmet as soon as riding a bike. Headlights must work (especially if you are planning to ride at night) and the outfit must be visible as much as possible.
- 9. Answer B.** It’s an obligation to wear the safety belt, even for a few minute’s course!
- 10. Answer A.** Children must seat in the rear in cars, and never in the front, even for a short course.
